- New Events
- Ongoing Events
 - Cameroon Cholera (1,194 cases, 66 deaths, CFR 5.5%). Trend has been increasing since the end of June. More females than males have been affected, and cholera treatment centers are accepting patients.

- Chad Measles (22,997 cases, 225 deaths, CFR 0.98%). There has been a slight decrease in incidence since the week ending May 2. Since January, 126 districts have reported cases, and the majority of those cases are in children less than five years old. A total of 81% of confirmed cases had not received a single dose of measles-containing vaccine.
- DRC Ebola Virus Disease (2,578 cases, 1,737 deaths, CFR 67%).
 Experts are continuing to see a decline in transmission. Seventy-seven new confirmed cases have been reported, with an additional 72 deaths. One hundred thirty-eight health workers have been affected (5%). Twenty-five health zones have reported at least one confirmed or probable case. Nineteen have reported confirmed cases in the last 21 days. Contact tracing is ongoing in 25 health zones, and WHO Director-General declared the EVD outbreak a Public Health Emergency of International Concern on July 17.

Humanitarian Crisis

O Burkina Faso. Violent attacks continue to cause mass population displacement, overstretching humanitarian response capacity. There are over 200,000 IDPs. Provision of basic services (health, education) has been interrupted, and the cost of purchasing medicine from street vendors is unaffordable. Skilled birth attendants are unavailable, aid workers have been attacked, and access to clean water sanitation and hygiene is limited.
