Respiratory Virus Activity Levels

(CDC.gov, updated February 21, 2025)

- The amount of acute respiratory illness causing people to seek healthcare is high
- ED visits
 - Diagnosed influenza: very high
 - RSV: moderate
 - COVID-19: low
- Test positivity
 - Influenza: 26.9%
 - RSV: 6.6%
 - COVID-19: 4.5%
- Wastewater
 - Influenza A: high
 - RSV: low
 - COVID-19: moderate
- Predictions: COVID ED visits will remain at a low to very low level; influenza ED vistis will remain high but are expected to decline

Percent of Tests Positive for Respiratory Viruses

Weekly percent of tests positive for the viruses that cause COVID-19, influenza, and RSV at the national level. Preliminary data are shaded in gray. Refer to <u>data notes</u> for more details.







In The News

- <u>Louisiana</u> no longer promoting routine vaccinations (Rejected by New Orleans' health officials)
- Mass <u>polio</u> vaccination campaign to continue in the Gaza Strip
- Measles cases in Texas balloon up to 90 cases 16 have been hospitalized, 5 cases are vaccinated. The rest are either unvaccinated, or their vaccination status is unknown
- NIH-funded clinical trial will evaluate new <u>dengue</u> therapeutic
