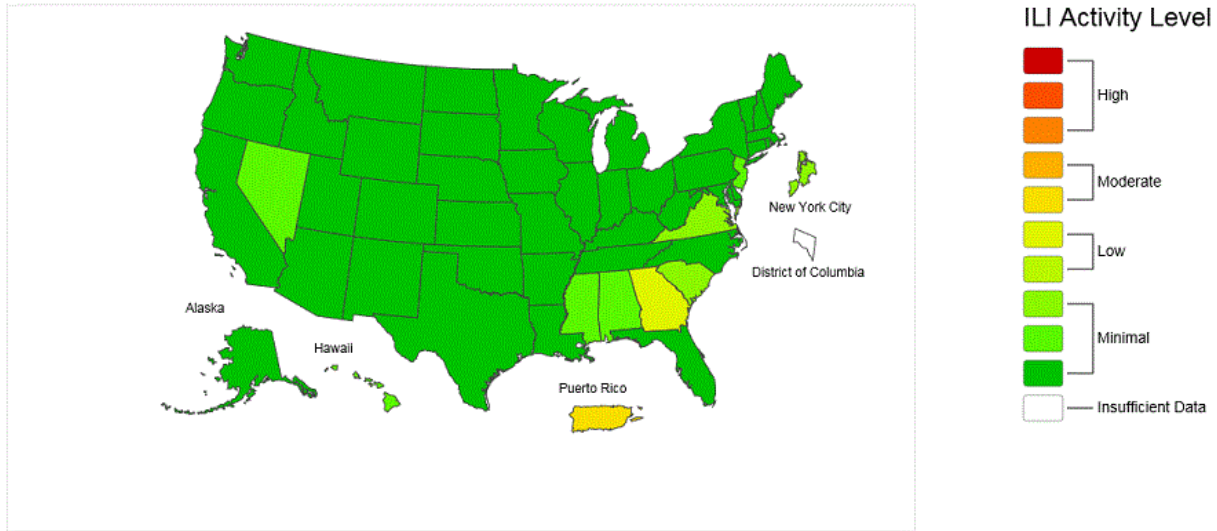


CDC Influenza Surveillance Report – week ending October 29, 2016

During week 44, (October 30-November 5, 2016), influenza activity was low in the United States.

**Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Activity Level Indicator Determined by Data Reported to ILINet
2016-17 Influenza Season Week 44 ending Nov 5, 2016**



Regional flu activity was reported by New Hampshire.

Local flu activity was reported by six states (California, Hawaii, Maine, Massachusetts, Oklahoma, and Oregon).

Sporadic flu activity was reported by the District of Columbia, and 39 states (Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, **Delaware**, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming).

No activity was reported by 4 states (Illinois, Nebraska, Rhode Island, and Vermont).

In Delaware, 1 case of flu was reported in Sussex County. There have been 5 cases reported in the 2016-2017 flu season.
