Estimated effect of inactivated Poliovirus Vaccine Campaigns, Nigeria and Pakistan, January 2014 – April 2016

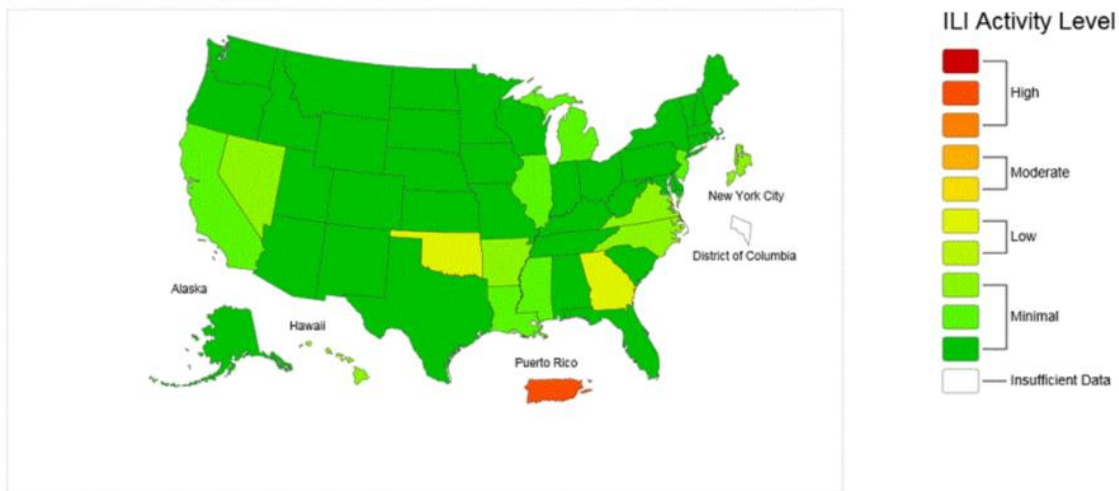

During week 45, (November 6-12, 2016), influenza activity was low in the United States.

**Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Activity Level Indicator Determined by Data Reported to ILINet  
 2016-17 Influenza Season Week 45 ending Nov 12, 2016**



Low influenza-like illness (ILI) activity was reported by Georgia and Oklahoma.

Minimal ILI activity was reported by 48 states (Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, **Delaware**, Florida, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming)

**In week 45, 2 cases of flu were reported in New Castle County, for a total of 7 cases reported in the 2016-2017 flu season.**
